At the June Ordinary Meeting of Council, the following were amongst considered items by Council:

### Planning Application

Council has endorsed conditional planning approval for the existing trade supplies activity/use on location 5971 Matthews Road, Jelcobine under Schedule 2 Clause 68 of the Planning and Development (Local Planning Schemes) Regulations 2015.

### Community Chest Fund Application

The Brookton CWA applied for funding under the Shire of Brookton Community Chest Funding. At their June meeting, Council endorsed the application to assist the CWA with ongoing costs for services to the Brookton community.

### Disability Access and Inclusion Plan 2018-2023

The Shire of Brookton Disability Access and Inclusion Plan Progress Report 2018-2023, tabled for Council review, was carried by a simple majority vote 7/0 and is now available on the Shire website.



# FOR FOODIES

## *One pot Chicken Stroganoff*

### Ingredients

- 1 tbsp olive oil
- 1 brown onion, halved and sliced
- 200g button mushroom, sliced
- 2 garlic cloves, crushed
- 1 tbsp tomato paste
- 1 tsp sweet paprika
- 300 ml cooking cream
- 125 ml chicken stock
- 1 medium cooked chicken cut into portions
- 2 tablespoons chopped parsley leaves to serve

### Method

- Step 1. **COOK THE SAUCE** Heat the oil in a large deep frying pan over medium heat. Cook the onion, stirring occasionally, for 4-5 minutes or until golden brown. Stir in the mushroom, garlic, tomato paste and paprika. Cook, stirring, for about 30 seconds then gradually pour in the cream and stock. Bring to a simmer then reduce heat to medium-low.
- Step 2. **WARM THE CHICKEN** Place the chicken in the sauce. Cover and cook for 3 minutes or until heated through.
- Step 3. **READY TO EAT** Scatter the parsley over the stroganoff just before serving.



## *One pot Chicken and Leek Casserole*

### Ingredients

- 2 tbsp plain flour
- 4 (about 1.4kg) chicken marylands, skin on
- 2 tbsp olive oil
- 225g speck, rind removed, cut into 1cm strips
- 250g small button mushrooms
- 2 leeks, trimmed, cut into 2cm thick slices
- 6 fresh thyme sprigs, plus extra to serve
- 2 garlic cloves, crushed
- 125ml dry white wine
- 250ml chicken stock
- 250ml thickened cream
- Cooked risoni pasta, to serve (optional)

### Method

- Step 1. Preheat the oven to 180C/160C fan-forced. Place the flour in a sealable plastic bag and season. Add the chicken and toss until well coated.
- Step 2. Heat the oil in a large flameproof dish or deep, ovenproof frying pan over medium-high. Add the chicken and cook for 4-5 minutes on each side or until golden. Transfer to a plate and set aside.
- Step 3. Add the speck, mushroom, leek and thyme to the dish, and cook, stirring occasionally, for 4-5 minutes or until the leek has softened. Add garlic and cook, stirring, for 30 seconds or until aromatic. Pour in white wine and cook, stirring, for 3-4 minutes or until the wine has reduced and almost evaporated. Stir in stock and cream, and bring to the boil. Remove from heat and return the chicken to the pan, skin-side up.
- Step 4. Bake for 45 minutes or until chicken is cooked through. Sprinkle with extra thyme sprigs and serve with risoni, if desired.

# GARDEN CORNER

## WHAT TO PLANT THIS MONTH

- Great time to plant in the temperate zones, so pop in some Brussels sprouts, cabbage, cauliflower and broccoli. Peas and beans can also go in, as well as radish, turnips, Swedes and spinach.
- It's time to get happy with herbs, so try some chamomile and lemon grass. You could give mint and lemon balm a go as well, but be careful to contain them as they can take over.
- Why not try some lovely flowering stuff in your patch as well, like: cornflower, calendula, dianthus, pansies, viola, snapdragons, stock, ageratum and marigolds. These guys are great at attracting pollinators and beneficial insects to your patch, and I reckon they look tops as well.

## GENERAL GARDEN CHORES

Plants feel the need for a feed at this time of year. A seaweed tea or low environmental impact liquid fertiliser is perfect, especially for the seedlings planted this month. Apply to the soil early in the morning, and in the concentrations mentioned on the packet.

You should start seeing bare rooted fruit and deciduous trees starting to appear in your local nursery. This is the cheapest and easiest way to purchase.



## Be Water Wise

Water smarter at this time of year. Water first thing in the morning, and instead of quickie irrigation, a nice, deep drink a couple of times a week is far more beneficial! Always check soil moisture before watering, don't waste your precious drinking water if Mother Nature has already done all the hard work for you!
