Animal Welfare – Prepare your property

By preparing your property, you can make it easier to care for the welfare of your animals in an emergency. This may include"

- Fitting gates on internal fences to avoid moving stock along public roads
- Ensure your animals always have a water supply that will last them at least five days, even if you expect to return home that evening
- Purchasing emergency fodder and food supplies and storing them in a safe place, preferably under cover and above flood levels
- Marking gates, food and water locations on a map of your property, and having the map in an easy to find place in case someone has to move animals for you
- Identifying areas of the house where smaller companion animals would be able to take shelter
- Identifying available safety equipment on property and installing fire extinguishers, sprinkler systems and smoke detectors
- Removing or clearing flammable items, especially near where animals might be kept, and removing rugs and halters from horses as these can often burn or melt
- Identifying or creating areas of higher ground where animals might be kept in flood prone properties
- Securing loose objects around the home that may become airborne during high winds and cause damage to animals and property

Free mammograms for BROOKTON women

BreastScreen WA's **FREE** screening mammogram service is coming to **Brookton from 29/01/2021 – 02/02/2021**, and the mobile clinic will be located at **Memorial Hall**, **opposite Shire Admin building, White Street.** Women 50 to 74 years are invited to have a FREE screening mammogram. (All women 40 years and over are eligible).

Breast cancer is the most common life threatening cancer for women and 1 in 7 women in Australia will develop breast cancer in their lifetime.

Having a screening mammogram (breast x-ray) every two years significantly increases the chance of a woman surviving breast cancer and reduces the amount of treatment required. More than 75% of breast cancers occur in women over the age of 50. Research shows that screening is most effective for this age group.

BreastScreen WA's Medical Director Dr Elizabeth Wylie, said screening mammography was the most effective method for early detection of breast cancer.

"Screening every two years is vitally important to increase the chance of a breast cancer being detected when it is too small to feel or be noticed. Finding a cancer at this early stage often means that the breast cancer is small and more treatable".

"A free screening mammogram is one of the best things that women can do to look after their health. Breast screening saves lives and only takes 20 minutes," said Dr Wylie.

Screening mammograms may detect 70-90% of breast cancers.

Any woman with a persistent change in a breast should contact her doctor immediately.

Dates may be subject to change. If visit dates are not suitable participants are welcome to book at the clinic in a different town or at any of our <u>permanent clinics</u>. For more information please visit BreastScreen WA's website <u>www.breastscreen.health.wa.gov.au</u>.

The holiday season can be a time of celebration, togetherness, and joy but for many, the holidays can bring added stress, anxiety and sadness. Issues such as financial hardship, family tensions, challenging social situations with friends or community, isolation, grief and conflict can easily intensify during this time. It is helpful, therefore, to have some strategies in place to manage these added pressures and to ensure that yourself, those you care about and your broader community are safe and connected this festive season.

- If you cannot spend the festive season with those you love, you can still connect virtually and include them in your celebrations. Through all the challenges of 2020, the one shining light has been the emergence of virtual platforms that can keep us connected with those we cannot be physically close to. If you are alone on Christmas Day, make plans in advance so that you can celebrate in your own way. It can be cooking yourself a special meal, going for a long walk, partaking in mindfulness or meditation, re-reading your favourite book, re-watching your favourite movie or attending a community event/gathering.
- For many people, 2020 has been a challenging, emotionally draining and stressful year. This festive season
 more than ever, it is important to not take on too much and over schedule yourself. Be realistic about your
 capacity during the festive season and share responsibilities and tasks with family and friends.
- Overindulge in laughter but be mindful not to overindulge in rich and fatty foods. Foods high in fat and sugar can affect and destabilise your mood.
- Christmas is more about presence than presents. What matters most are connections, laughter, shared experiences and making memories not the amount of money that you have spent on gifts.
- It is also time to stop and reflect that whilst we might be looking forward to the festive season, for others Christmas is a reminder of sad, troubling, and traumatic events in their lives. Remember to be mindful and sensitive to the reactions of others. That grumpy person at the shops, that person who will not engage in any of the 'fun'...they all have own journey and story. When you find yourself thinking "what is wrong with you", think "what has happened to you" instead. Strive to be kind with your words, non-judgemental in your thinking and generous in your interactions (even when the other person does not demonstrate these things). You just might create a moment of happiness for someone who really needs it!
- With the opening of our boarders, it is a time to maintain all the good hygiene and safety measure that have been put in place by the WA Government. Ensuring that you have downloaded the Keep Safe WA App is a good place to start.
- Trust your gut instincts this festive season and if you think somebody may be struggling reach out and ask "Are you OK?", "How are you travelling?" by connecting, asking and listening we can help our family, friends and members of our community feel more supported. Take the time to listen and encourage them to partake in help seeking behaviours. Remember there is immense power in CONNECTIONS.
- It's important to schedule time for yourself. SELF CARE is very important during the busy festive season. Allocate time to do things that are good for your physical, emotional and mental health SELF CARE is the greatest gift that you can give to yourself.

- This time of the year it is very important to ensure that we are responsible and safe with our consumption of alcohol. Easy guidelines to follow:
 - Set yourself a drinks limit, count how many you've had and stop when you've reached it.
 - Have a few alcohol-free days each week.
 - Swap to low or no alcohol alternatives.
 - Delay your first drink.
 - o Make every second drink a non-alcoholic drink.
 - Slow down your drinking.
- Reach out to people living alone and make them feel included. Invite them for a cuppa or deliver a hand-made Christmas card or some home baked treats. If you have developed a good connection, make a point of making a quick 'check in' phone call on Christmas Day to see how they are.
- Inevitably, this time of year brings its own stresses and strains. Putting strategies in place and being mindful about how you are feeling are the first steps to managing anxiety and enjoying the celebrations. Put your health and wellbeing FIRST and remember to be kind to yourself.

If you are feeling stressed out about Christmas, have experienced mental health problems like stress and depression in the past, or are concerned about the wellbeing of somebody that you care about, make sure you are familiar with where support can be accessed during the festive period:



Now farming wasn't all that would ignite my ratbag heart, Community meant so much to me, I loved to play my part. I joined the local Choral Society, adding zest and fun, I really loved to make 'em laugh, dressed up for everyone.

Oh, did someone mention tennis? Strewth, I took that up as well, And the racquet in my hand I served a ball that raised some hell. The years rolled by and finally we all managed to construe, A tennis set called 'Hit and Giggle' in our old boy crew.

And sometime long ago, within my fun filled life, oh boy, I found that I'd become a Pop to six little bundles of joy. I'd stir them up by telling them they're much smarter than this man, And deep inside my heart I was so happy for my clan.
